This year has been one chock full of growth. Not only did we return to in-person tutoring, we did so as a team of five! This felt remarkably different. We could implement ideas that were mere pipe dreams in the past. We assessed students' English and Math levels, built curriculum for tutors to use, ran a large fundraising campaign and even applied for and got a new, substantial grant!

While it has been both an invigorating and hopeful time, the learning curve was extraordinarily high. From onboarding 3 new employees to vetting accounting companies, I have had to learn a whole new jargon: nonprofit insurance, IRS Form 990, building a board matrix, the list goes on. While I have always been an eager learner, I have been drinking from a fire hose this year with a new challenge at every corner. However, challenges provide opportunities for growth. It has been a joy to watch TEAM SDRT expand, see dreams realized before my eyes and watch this organization grow up.

It has also been a joy to watch our kids grow up. The crying Syrian toddler who refused to go to preschool just completed fifth grade, receiving multiple honor awards in addition to her promotion certificate. Our easily frustrated new student from the Central African Republic didn't come close to shutting down on the stage at his promotion as he so often used to years ago. Instead, he got the award for "Making the Most Growth" and wore the most gratifying smile. A large group of first grade

boys arrived in our country several years ago with uncontainable energy and a palpable desire to learn. They required extra snacks, sensory chairs, extra motivating rewards and even mid-tutoring sprints up and down the hallways. Those boys are becoming men as they head into their eighth grade year, with several attending The Preuss School at UCSD. They recently had the privilege of showcasing their work to tutors, who still support them all these years later.

SDRT is here for the long haul and it matters. This year marks our fourteenth year of showing up for kids on a regular basis. We are headed into our sixth anniversary as a formal non-profit. We are transitioning our employee formalities, board principles, and organizational procedures to stand the test of time so that SDRT will be around for our kids as they continue to grow up.

of tutoring were provided




